

NDD Ambassadors

NDD Clean Ambassadors

NDD Clean Ambassadors are easily visible in the district in their yellow and black uniforms. Armed with an arsenal of tools that keep the 110 blocks of the downtown sparkling clean, they cover comprehensive routes throughout their daily shifts, removing litter, sweeping sidewalks, and emptying and disinfecting trash receptacles. Their attention to detail shows as they wipe down pedestrian touch points, benches, planters, and trash cans, and it is clear that it is the NDD Clean Team who is responsible for keeping the downtown district so clean and pleasing to the eye.

NDD Quality of Life Ambassadors

NDD Quality of Life (QOL) Ambassadors are the hospitality ambassadors for the downtown district, and their most vital role is to provide friendly and useful services to people living, working, and visiting downtown Newark. They are the "Eyes and Ears" of the district, available to provide personal assistance, such as help crossing a busy street, suggestions of restaurants to satisfy any culinary craving, directions to Newark's many cultural and entertainment venues, and even parking tips! QOL Ambassadors meet regularly with NDD stakeholders and also report daily observations of district conditions in need of attention or repair. They are equipped with two-way radios and can send reports directly to the Newark Police Department for quick assistance.

NDD Horticulture Ambassadors

NDD Horticulture Ambassadors are responsible for the Downtown District's over 300 planters, which are adorned with lush foliage and colorful flowers. Three times a year, the NDD planters receive new seasonal installments. Daily inspections of the planters include replacing and trimming plants, and caring for plant reserves. Other beautification tasks include weeding the entire district and mulching the district tree pits, and cleaning and cutting the grass all along the manicured greenway on the southern end of McCarter Highway and the Portraits Mural going north. This team really has a green thumb!

NDD Special Projects Ambassadors

This special team of multi-talented Ambassadors are assigned to diverse work projects. For example, during the day they might tackle unwanted stickers and graffiti, while the overnight team scrubs the sidewalks of the district with a power washer, blasting away dirt and grime. Another overnight team waters the 300 planters and hanging baskets, keeping the plants strong and healthy. This team can also be seen with a paintbrush in hand, painting light poles, bollards, and trash cans. NDD Special Projects Ambassadors are also the builders of the parklets that pop up in the spring, and the production team for setting up and breaking down NDD events.

Horticulture

Every year the NDD Horticulture Team focuses on district beautification and horticulture maintenance. Starting in May, NDD Ambassadors install three seasonal plantings and care for over 300 district planters throughout the year. The NDD Horticulture Team is also responsible for the grass maintenance at the NDD-adopted McCarter Highway entryway, the Washington Monument, and Monsignor Doane Park.

Together the NDD Horticulture Team works cohesively with other NDD services to create a visually pleasing and inviting atmosphere on Newark streetscapes throughout the year.

In 2021, the NDD organized a number of partnerships with the City of Newark and community organizations to facilitate horticulture events and plant donations. To kick off the spring season, the NDD produced a grant-funded community tree planting event with the New Jersey Tree Foundation (NJTF) and City of Newark. During the event, 40 volunteers from the greater Newark community joined NDD Ambassadors and NJTF staff to plant 22 trees on streets near Washington Park.

The NDD then partnered with the City of Newark and Greater Newark Conservancy to start annual spring and fall community plant donation events. These events will allow the NDD to reduce plant waste by donating plant material removed from NDD streetscape planters during seasonal swap-outs. This year's donation events distributed over 700 plants to over 40 residents and community organizations from the greater Newark area.

In addition to community plant donation events, the NDD donated over 200 grow bags planted with annuals and hydrangeas received from the Fifth Avenue Partnership to the City of Newark's Parks Department. The Parks Department used the grow bags in Military Park to beautify the sword.

NDD Downtown Market

The NDD Downtown Market returned every Thursday (weather permitting) from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm at the PSE&G/Prudential Plaza, from June 24 until September 30. The market included live music, a farm stand hosted by the Urban Agriculture Cooperative, arts and crafts vendors, physical fitness activations, and information tables highlighting local community-based organizations.

The 2021 NDD Downtown Market featured a seating area dedicated to food delivery services from downtown restaurants and a pop-up vaccination clinic run by the City of Newark Health Department, Partners in Health, and the North Jersey Community Research Initiative.

To encourage shopping at multiple vendors, the NDD launched a new marketing promotion at the NDD Downtown Market—the Frequent Shopper Card. Each shopper received a punch card, and for every \$5 purchase they made, shoppers were able to get their card punched. Once they received five punches, they brought the card to the NDD kiosk and redeemed it for a prize. All submitted cards became part of a raffle to win a gift basket.

To show support for the NDD Downtown Market vendors, the NDD purchased items from all participating vendors and used the merchandise to create the gift baskets raffled at the end of the market season.



NDD Parklet Program

The NDD Parket Program enjoyed its fourth successful year in 2021. A parklet is an extension of the sidewalk into the street, exchanging curbside road space for an additional public gathering space. The NDD expanded the Parklet Program this year to aid downtown businesses and provide extra outdoor seating areas. Six pop-up parklets were built in addition to the four traditional wooden structures, adding 10 new outdoor spaces for pedestrian activities and al fresco dining. Each of the NDD parklet structures was designed to comply with CDC guidelines and included hand-sanitizing dispensers, social distancing signs, ADA ramps, outdoor furniture, and most importantly, shade structures such as umbrellas or gazebos.

To attract more visitors to the parklets and encourage passing shoppers to visit local businesses, the NDD hosted a pop-up-concert series. These mini-concerts took place every other Tuesday at different parklet locations during lunchtime hours and featured different local artists offering a variety of music styles.

Programs and Projects

From the Heart

The NDD's From the Heart program continued into 2021 to deliver fresh meals to people in need throughout Newark. When COVID-19 hit and the long-term effects of the pandemic became apparent, the NDD worked quickly to begin this two-part program, which supported local restaurants and eateries and aided residents experiencing food insecurity. Donations were collected from generous individual and corporate donors eager to help the Newark community. The NDD then contacted restaurants to prepare fresh meals, which the NDD Ambassadors delivered to families, senior homes, and shelters around Newark.

Grow with Google

In the spring of 2021, the NDD hosted a four-part webinar series called Grow with Google. Grow with Google is a free service that provides complimentary training to help small businesses adapt, grow, and better serve the community. The NDD partnered with the Newark Public Library, Newark Regional Business Partnership, Forward Ever Sustainable Business Alliance, Makerhoods, SCORE-Metro NJ, and Invest Newark to host training webinars for local businesses. The webinar topics included "Reach Customers Online with Google," "Get Your Local Business on Google Search and Maps," "Using YouTube to Grow Your Business," and "Make Your Website Work for You."

Social Media Training for Small Businesses

At the request of the Downtown community, the NDD co-hosted a free webinar with NJ.com to teach small businesses basic knowledge about social media and its importance. Some of the topics covered included types of social media networks, how to get started, how to engage your audience, how using social media can help to enhance your business, and how to make social media work best for you. To help promote the webinar, the NDD partnered with Invest Newark, Newark Regional Business Partnership, the Newark Public Library, Forward Ever Sustainable Business Alliance, and Makerhoods.

NDD Fall Festival

This year we launched our first annual NDD Fall Festival. It was a day of entertainment and celebration for everyone to enjoy. Taking place in Military Park, the NDD Fall Festival brought out people of all ages—from families with small children, to teenagers and senior citizens. Attractions included pony rides with a petting zoo, a pumpkin patch with pumpkin decorating, face-painting, a Halloween costume contest, a photo booth, free games, live music, food, and more! The NDD Fall Festival was a great day of community fun for everyone and we can't wait until next year!

Community Partnerships

Rotary Club of Newark

In the summer of 2021, the NDD had an opportunity to partner with the Rotary Club of Newark, who donated thousands of books as part of its Read4Life project. The NDD accepted many of these books for our "Little Free Library" program, started in 2013 to add to the District's amenities, and is based on the donation and sharing of books with the public. This generous book donation will enable the NDD QOL Ambassadors to easily keep the Little Free Library stocked with books.

COVID-19 Vaccines

The NDD partnered with several organizations to provide COVID vaccines at the NDD Downtown Market during the summer of 2021. Working with the City of Newark Department of Health, the Partners in Health and the North Jersey Community Research Initiative provided information and staff to administer the vaccines. During select weeks, a van was on site providing a mobile vaccine station as well. The pop-up vaccine services provided an a convenient opportunity for the community to receive their COVID vaccines.

HalseyFest

NDD partnered with HalseyFest for their annual community festival full of entertainment, arts, games, food, and more! We promoted the event through our social media and emails, and the NDD Red Urban Bears visited multiple businesses on Halsey Street during the week leading up to the event to generate excitement about the festival. The NDD also provided in-kind Ambassador production and cleanup services, and had a presence at the event sharing information about the organization and joining in on the fun with NDD flair.



NDD Red Urban Bears

Who are they?

The red bears were created by six cutting edge artists who utilized recycled plastics to create the animal sculptures, and each sculpture conveys a specific meaning for the urban environment. The bears symbolize nature because they are created from recycled material, thus leaving a minimal carbon footprint—this is to inspire people to re-examine existing perceptions of urban life, and rejuvenate them into more healthy and vibrant environments.

What is their message?

The philosophy behind the traveling art is that it gives people the opportunity to play with the city in order to rebuild it ideally and mentally. The NDD chose the bear because it symbolizes both power and resurgence: following the bear's season of introspection, it emerges—undeniably dynamic and fiercely energetic- just like the City of Newark. The bears are meant to send a message of spirit and strength, confidence and victory, and, because they prefer peace and tranquility, bears symbolize harmony and balance.

Social Media and Local Business Support



Financial Update

Revenue

The NDD is a Special Improvement District (SID) that is funded through a special assessment paid by private and residential property owners. The Revenue portion of this budget is from those SID assessments, which are billed and collected by the City's Tax Collection department and turned over to the NDD for operation management.

Total Revenue: **\$5,071,250**

Expenses

General Administration

The General Administration and Overhead portion of the budget includes typical corporate operating expenses: rent, utilities, insurance, computer equipment and supplies, accounting services, legal services, office supplies, telephone service, conferences, management and staff salaries, health benefits, and associated expenses.

Capital Improvement Project

The NDD has partnered with the City of Newark in a Capital Project to improve the overall streetscape of the entire SID. This comprehensive project incorporates decorative street furniture, signage, pedestrian-scale lighting, landscaping, trash receptacles, planters, and tree pits.

Marketing and Promotions

One of the primary goals of the NDD is to promote and reinforce the many advantages of living, working, and going to school in Newark. The NDD mission also includes finding ways to attract new visitors and increase the quality of life for current residents through events and programs. Marketing materials such as banners, collateral pieces, social media, and the NDD website all promote Newark events and businesses. General Administration Total: **\$1,755,200**

Operations

The Operations portion of the NDD's budget includes a Horticulture plan for seasonal plantings, irrigation, and other horticulture needs, as well as funding for the maintenance of the Capital Project Streetscape Elements. It also includes the highly commended Clean Ambassadors, Quality of Life (QOL) Ambassadors, Horticulture Ambassadors, and Special Projects Ambassadors. In addition to their daily cleaning tasks, NDD Ambassadors also complete special projects such as painting, pruning, weeding, power washing of sidewalks/buildings, and Snow/Ice-removal, Urban Planning, and the Security Task Force.
